Before: We embarked on the huge task to turn the small, dilapidated structure into a habitable house in the month of April. Thanks 42 friends who responded promptly.

During: Unfortunately, the builder underestimated the cost of tearing the renovation of the old structure and did not include all the

materials we needed to set up a new room and bathroom attached to it, but there was no turning back.

Challenge: We started at the time when prices of almost every bit of material went crazy, the



underestimated budget shrunk further. Causing lots of delays in between phases. The builders were another challenge, they kept shifting the goal posts of the agreed labour fees which led to switching workers on three occasions.

Status: Generally, the house is completed both the interior and exterior and so on the 20th of August (City wide seed projects day) I officially handed over the house as it is to Sula and Noelina. Three key items remain: the interior flash doors, electricity, and water connections.



I had also wished to furnish it with a set of chairs, a bed, and beddings but that will probably be for another day. (Justin Guma S1F zone leader) had the honors to offer the house dedication prayer.
